






Owl Class Update

Kestrel Class Update

Kestrels have had another busy and exciting week in school! In Literacy, we have started a brand-new unit based on The Lizzie and Belle Mysteries: Drama and Danger. Set in 1700s London, the story follows a young girl and the attempted murder of her father, Ignatius Sancho. This week, the children have enjoyed listening to the story and getting to know the characters. In Maths, we have been working through tests and reviewing our answers to deepen our understanding. This has helped us reflect on our learning and strengthen our problem-solving skills. Afternoons have been filled with creative and scientific exploration. In Art, we continued working on sculptures for our memory boxes, adding detail and personal touches. In Science, we investigated reversible and irreversible changes by heating different substances such as bread, jelly, chocolate, ice, butter, and cheese. We discovered that some materials, like melted chocolate, could return to their original state when cooled, while others, like toasted bread, underwent permanent changes.




