We've had a great couple of weeks in Fox class. Some of the work we have done in maths has been fantastic! We have been playing lots of 'games' to really practice our maths and embed our learning. We thoroughly enjoyed our PE lessons and our day of alternative sports as well. Archery was definitely the most popular of the sports! We have also been closely monitoring our seeds, that we planted with Owl class a few weeks ago, which have germinated very quickly! Seeing them grow so quickly means we're very excited to see how much they have grown each morning.





Owl Class Update

We had a fantastic day outdoors with Wild Tribe, and we are grateful to those who remembered to bring waterproofs and spare clothing. These items definitely came in handy. Our writing has been focused on creating our own story inspired by Yeti and the Bird, and I'm incredibly impressed with the children's use of various skills in their writing. In math, Year 1 has started learning about multiplication and division, while Year 2 is diving into fractions. We learned a lot from the visit by the lifeguard. During our science lesson, we went on a hunt to identify flowers and trees, learning about their common parts and even being able to name some common species.







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Otter Class Update

Otter Class have a had a great week involving lots of wildtribe and outdoor learning.

Our trip to the Woodland skills centre at Lewtrenchard on Monday was brilliant. The children had lots of fun building fires, toasting marshmallows and making wooden pendants. Then again on Tuesday, we had fun building dens and hugging trees.

We have continued to use 'The Ever changing Earth' as our hook for writing and are really beginning to apply the writing skills we have been taught throughout the year. In science and DT we continue to look at electricity and building circuits and have enjoyed investigating different materials to test if they are conductors or insulators. We are looking forward to applying this knowledge to building our torches. In computing and PSHE we have been looking at sending emails and identifying fake or scam emails as well as learning how to send emails.

In maths we have grappled with fractions in Year 3 and the pesky decimal point in Year 4. We have also been practicing our arithmetic and time stables and have really been challenging ourselves to learning the facts to recall them quickly.

Kestrel Class News

We've had an exciting week in Kestrels! In science we continued to look at classification which led us into the world of animal classification with Carl Linnaeus, providing fascinating insights into how animals are categorized. This system is still used today. Within Geography we continued our journey through deserts, uncovering the mysteries of salt pans and unique rock formations. In DT, we delved into the origins of our food, tracing its path from farm to fork. The highlight of our week was our Wild Tribe Day, where we crafted stretchers and shelters, showcasing teamwork and resilience even amidst torrential rain.
