
## Science



Identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds, and mammals.

Identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores, and omnivores.

Describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals (fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds, and mammals including pets) Explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive.

Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.

Identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including microhabitats.

Notice that animals have offspring which grow into adults. Find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air).


