Reception has continued to enjoy exploring the various learning resources in the classroom. This week, we have begun focusing on a new story, "My Monster and Me." During phonics, we are continuing to learn our set 1 sounds, and I am amazed at how much reading the children are doing at home. Thank you for your support with this, as reading at home greatly contributes to the children's progress!













Owl Class Update

Owl Class this week have been building up to and writing their version of the story 'The Journey Home'. This book has certainly led to some great discussions about caring for our environment and thinking about protecting animal habitats. Both of these topics have also thread through Science and RE and the children are making some great links.

In RE the children have been continuing their learning about the Creation Story in Christianity and have been thinking about how Christians say thank you to God. We have had some great conversations about Harvest and what this means for us a rural community as well as for Christians.

All of the children in Owls have been working really hard on their phonics and I'm sure that after their up coming assessments we will see some great progress and moving to new coloured books. Please keep reading with your child at home, this is essential to help them embed the new and previously taught sounds. It also helps to develop a love of reading.

In Maths, Year 1 have been looking at number bonds to 10 and beginning of addition and have really used the equipment, such as the 10s frames, to help. Year 2s have been looking at addition and subtraction and also using the 10s frame and base 10 to support this.

The children have been exploring the characters and debating whether he'll be accepted or rejected. In science, we've been investigating magnetic fields through hands-on experiments, discovering how magnets interact with each other. We also enjoyed a visit from author Alexandra Dawe, who shared insights into her book, The Stitchwort Curse, and introduced us to the world of spiders, which play a central role in her storytelling. It was an inspiring experience for all!














KS2 Author Visit
