Pupil Premium Report 2019-2020

The Government allocates additional money, known as Pupil Premium to the main school funding. This is felt to be the best way to address inequalities between children eligible for free school meals and their less disadvantaged peers by focusing funding on narrowing the attainment gap. Schools are required to annually report on how this additional money is spent and the impact this has had on the progress and attainment of pupils.

Our current disadvantaged children show a variety of barriers to their learning

- Additional Special Educational Needs
- Lack the acquisition of high quality and varied vocabulary
- Lack of experiences within the area where they live
- Regular inattendance preventing children to make progress to the best of their abilities

During the period September 2019-September 2020 the pupil premium funding will be used to support children both academically and emotionally and will enable all children to achieve to the best of their ability. Support for families to improve attendance will also increase the progress for a number of the children.

Pupil Premium Action Plan 2019-2020

provision	Cost	Success Criteria
60% funding for educational visits	£1100	Disadvantaged children will experience the same opportunities, leading to enrichment of life experiences and vocabulary.
Breakfast Club	£2700	Disadvantaged children will have the opportunity to be ready to learn at the start of the day which will support their progress and attainment. Disadvantaged children will have been given breakfast which will fulfill a basic level of need required to learn.
Music Therapy	£3100	Disadvantaged children will receive highly focused therapy to support them through

		trauma. This will support their emotional literacy which will enable them to progress to the best of the ability within the classroom.
Music Teacher from Cornwall Music Hub	£2886	This will enable disadvantaged children the opportunity to receive quality first teaching of music.
Interventions provided by lower school teaching assistant	£3515	Disadvantaged children within the lower school will receive focused interventions to support the closing of gaps, daily reading opportunity and providing appropriate challenge to support their progress and attainment
Interventions provided by upper school teaching assistants	£5081	Disadvantaged children within the upper school will receive focused interventions to support the closing of gaps, daily reading opportunity and providing appropriate challenge to support their progress and attainment. Provision also includes supporting the teaching of a highly differentiated curriculum for a disadvantaged child who also has special educational needs.
1:1 support assistant	£3784	Academic and emotional support for a disadvantaged child who also has special educational needs. This support assistant is also Thrive trained and provides emotional support to other disadvantaged children. This enables each child to confidentially share their worries and concerns therefore fulfilling a basic need which subsequently enables them to actively participate in their learning in the classroom.
